An operating line of \$5,000 annually will address the short term goals from BHAC report. A transfer to a new Reserve Fund for Beaverton Harbour will help address long term goals.

2022 New Initiative - Municipal Property Review

March 2021, Council directed staff to identify municipal property boundaries and potential surplus sales of municipally owned property. This direction came about from a request from three separate resident who were trying to buy municipally owned property. Through the investigation, a number of ownership issues were identified which will require a real estate lawyer to determine who the rightful owner is before we can report back.
